FEES

Fees are determined by Council from time to time and are subject to revision without notice.

1. TERMS OF PAYMENT

A registered student is personally liable for all tuition and accommodation fees, notwithstanding any pledges of support or bursary that they may have received.

It should be noted that the contract which forms part of the application form for admission to the University of Cape Town and which to that end was signed by the student and/or their legal guardian, legally binds those parties to pay the full tuition and accommodation fees for a year of registration as determined by the University. This liability is not affected nor reduced through ignorance on the part of the student/guardian regarding the rules and regulations of the University of Cape Town or of the validity of his/her registration in terms of the said rules and regulations.

Since a student's fee account is based on his/her academic record and accommodation choices, it is their responsibility to verify the correctness of this information.

1.1 **Tuition Fees**

Students will be charged for all academic courses for which they register.

First payment is due on or before 07 February 2025

We do not issue detailed statements of account prior to the first payment date. It is therefore the responsibility of the student to pay the first payment as set out below by the due date.

Each student must make a first payment of academic fees, as follows, by 07 February 1.1.1 2025, subject to a one-off late payment surcharge of 5%. This includes students who intend registering after the payment date, for example postgraduate students.

> Students registering at the Graduate School of Business see point (b) below for first payment due dates. Qualification not listed in point (b) the due date is 07 February 2025.

For the first payment of residence fees, refer to 13.1.

Balance of all fees is due by 31 July 2025.

Allow at least 14 working days for payment to appear in UCT bank account to avoid delays in registration clearance being granted.

- 1.1.2 The University of Cape Town does not accept responsibility for incorrect addresses, blocked e-mails or postal service deficiencies resulting in statements of account not being received. It is the responsibility of the student to make enquiries should he/she not receive a statement of account. The fact that no statement of account has been received will not be accepted as a reason for failure to pay the university fees by due date.
- 1.1.3 Where a student has applied to the bank for a student loan, the first payment deadline will be extended until 31 March 2025, provided that the Fees Office receives a confirmation letter of an approved loan from the bank. No further extensions will be granted.

1.1.4 **Bursaries and Sponsorship**

Any student who has been made a firm offer of an external bursary or scholarship must provide the Fees Office with written evidence from his/her sponsors and may deduct one half of the annual award from the first payment of fees due. Awards which have not been confirmed by the due date for payment of fees may not be used to reduce the first payment due. Such awards when confirmed will be credited towards fees due by 31 July 2025. Students who are uncertain on receiving a bursary, which subsequently does not materialize, will not have an adjustment made to the 5% surcharge raised on short payment of the first payment or to interest charged.

1.1.5 Final payment must be made by 31 July 2025

Payment of the balance of fees is due on 31 July 2025. We send out detailed statements of account every month from March onwards.

- 1.1.6 Interest is charged on overdue accounts at 1% per month.
- 1.1.7 Where a student registers for the first time in the second semester of an academic year, the full fees (including residence, if applicable) are payable on registration or prior to registration for International Students including those from SADC countries. If fees are unpaid and student registration has been allowed due to residency, the fees are due immediately and interest is payable.
- 1.1.8 Where a student adds one or more courses at the start of the second semester of an academic year, the fees in respect thereof are due immediately and payable within 30 days of registration including summer term. Interest is charged on overdue accounts at 1% per month.
- 1.1.9 For fee purposes the same rules and conditions apply to a student who is provisionally registered at the University of Cape Town as for a registered student.
- All fees due to the University are a first charge on any scholarship, bursary or loan granted 1.1.10 by the University or paid to the University from other sources for the benefit of the student. If the total of bursaries/scholarships exceeds fees due, the balance may be drawn by the student in two equal instalments after 07 February and 31 July if the University has received payment of the bursary and the refund is agreed to by the sponsor.
- A student to whom an advance is to be made, or to whom residual funds are to be disbursed, 1.1.11 is required to capture his/her banking details on the PeopleSoft Student System via the Student Portal URL: http://studentsonline.uct.ac.za.

6 TERMS OF PAYMENT

Payments are made by electronic funds transfer and cannot be processed unless bank details have been entered. Students need to keep these current to avoid delays and payments being processed to incorrect bank accounts.

Payments made by online credit card will be refunded back to the same credit card if request is done within the allowable period.

- 1.1.12 A student who has a credit balance on his/her fee account because of an external payment, will not be refunded until at least 14 days have elapsed from the credit of the payment to his/her fee account.
- 1.1.13 Student identity cards must be produced at the Fees Office when withdrawals or refunds from fees accounts are requested. Students will be requested to provide supporting documentation where required.
- 1.1.14 Any case which may not be provided for in these rules will be subject to the ruling of the

1.2 Residence Fees

Students who will be entering UCT student accommodation should refer to Section 13 of this handbook.

1.3 Method of Payment

When making payment the alpha/numeric student number must be used as the reference to ensure prompt credit of payment to the student fees account.

Direct Deposits/Internet Transfers/Cash Payments can be made into the University's bank account at Standard Bank, Rondebosch; Branch Code 025009, Account Number 27 068 9982. The student number must be used as the reference.

Credit card payments can be made at the Cashiers Office by the card-holder; on-line directly to the student fee account via the UCT website URL: http://payonline.uct.ac.za.

No cash payments will be accepted at the Cashiers Office.

Foreign cheques will not be accepted.

Where payment is being made for students from outside the South African rand currency area, payment must be made by telegraphic transfer into the University's bank account at Standard Bank, Rondebosch; Branch Code 025009, Account Number 27 068 9982, Swift address SBZA ZAJJ. Students paying international fees should consult the International Office (see Section 5).

Students should allow at least 14 working days for such foreign payments to reach the UCT bank account. Clearance will only be given when payment has been received.

Exclusive to full-time international students: Utilize the Flywire online payment platform for transactions made from an international bank account.

A copy of the deposit slip/transfer form should be e-mailed to the Fees Office, University of Cape Town, fnd-feeeng@uct.ac.za to assist with the timeous allocation of payments to the appropriate fees account.

1.4 **Payments Received**

All payments received will be applied in the first instance to any amount outstanding from the prior year debt. Thereafter payments made will be applied against current year debt in the following order:

Tuition charges,

Residence and meal charges,

External Bursars Allowances,

Finance administration and miscellaneous charges.

1.5 **Outstanding Fees**

Students with outstanding balances on their fees account exceeding R1 000:

- (a) will not be permitted to graduate:
- (b) will not receive their examination results;
- will not receive an academic transcript; (c)

Students with outstanding balances on their fees account exceeding R10 000:

- (d) will not be permitted to re-register in the following year;
- (e) will not be permitted to register for Summer Term programmes which start in the next academic year:
- (f) will have any offer of a place in residence cancelled if outstanding fees are not paid by 30 November 2024;
- (g) will not have any subsequent application processed until debt has been settled in full.
- 1.5.1 Students who have outstanding fees, fines, interest, current registration of occasional nondegree studies or dues will not be awarded degrees or diplomas in:
 - March, if any amount is unpaid by 19 December 2024 (i)
 - (ii) September, if any amount is unpaid by 10 July 2025 Any changes to the graduation month; fee deadlines will be communicated accordingly
- 1.5.2 We charge interest monthly on outstanding balances at 1%. Where the final fee payment date is 31 July, interest is charged on outstanding balances at 1% per month from 31 August and at the end of each succeeding month.
- 1.5.3 A student whose fees are not paid by the due date, and who has not produced evidence of receipt of a bursary/scholarship/loan, may be excluded from attendance at classes or from a residence or a student housing unit.
- 1.5.4 Where a student has prior year outstanding fees, payments received will be allocated to clear unpaid interest first, followed by the oldest debt.
- 1.5.5 A student must check his/her fee account on a regular basis. This is especially important

prior to the year-end. Various charges may be debited to fee accounts if the student has not settled these in cash, and these include library fines, traffic fines, student health charges and residence damage costs. Such charges will often appear on fee accounts late in the year. Students can access their fee account from the UCT website via the Student Portal URL: http://studentsonline.uct.ac.za.

2. ACADEMIC FEES

All students from outside South Africa, including students from SADC countries, should also refer to fees for international students in Section 5 of this handbook.

The University of Cape Town operates on a course-based fee structure inclusive of all "add-ons". Thus, the dictum that 'the price you see is the price you pay' applies to all academic offerings across the University.

Please note that residence, catering, and miscellaneous fees such as subscriptions to clubs and societies are itemised and charged separately on the student fee account.

The University's all-inclusive course-based fee structures published in Section 12 of this booklet, together with the relevant Faculty handbook, will enable students to accurately calculate the cost of their academic studies at UCT in 2025.

The Faculty handbook will indicate the courses that can be taken in pursuing a qualification and the relevant course code. Use this code to look up the all-inclusive cost of the course in this booklet. The sum of these costs will give you the total cost for the set of chosen courses as there are no levies or additional academic charges.

Faculty handbooks containing the curriculum for each qualification can be obtained from the relevant faculty office and this information is also available on the UCT web site: Handbooks | University of Cape Town (uct.ac.za)

Since a student's fees account is based on his/her academic load, it is the student's responsibility to verify the correctness of his/her enrolment for courses in the current year.

To assist first time applicants, the table below lists fees for typical first-year undergraduate degrees for South African applicants. It will give you an idea of what the fees are likely to be. They may vary a bit depending on actual choice of courses.

2.2 Notice to Leave: Withdrawal of Registration

A registered student is personally liable for all tuition fees notwithstanding any pledges of support or bursary that they may have received.

Students must give notice of intention to discontinue studies in writing by completing the Cancellation of Registration Form and uploading it via Service Request on PeopleSoft. The student card must be submitted to their Faculty Office in person or by registered mail.

A R500 Administration Fee will be charged on all cancellations / withdrawals. International students, including those from SADC countries, refer to Section 5

A reduction on the academic fees may be considered in special circumstances, depending on when the cancellation of Registration Form is uploaded via Service Request on PeopleSoft. If received before:

2.2.1 GSB students

Rebates for tuition fees (acceptance and administration fees are not rebated) may be granted depending on when the online application of intention to discontinue studies is received by the GSB Faculty Office.

The unique nature of GSB programmes/courses precludes the organisation from replacing students once a programme/courses has commenced. Consequently, and with due consideration of Section 17(2) of the Consumer Protection Act, the following reduction in the academic fees *may* be considered in special circumstances, depending on when the notice of intention to discontinue studies is received by the Faculty Office:

Programmes/courses commence on the day a student is required to be at orientation. No reduction will be granted if the notice to withdraw is received after the above deadlines.

No withdrawal is possible after the 'cancel transcript' entry date.

Note: These dates will be strictly adhered to. Any fees owing is due immediately on cancellation of studies.

2.3 Drop an Individual Course

Students must give notice of intention to withdraw from individual courses in writing by completing the Change of Curriculum Form and uploading it via Service Request on PeopleSoft. When students withdraw from individual courses of a minimum duration of one semester, any fee reduction is dependent upon the date of withdrawal. If the course duration is less than one semester, there is no fee reduction if a student withdraws from the course after it begins.

No reduction will be granted if the Change of Curriculum Form is uploaded via Service Request on Peoplesoft after the above deadlines. Should a student register late the same number of days will be applied to calculate the rebate.

After the last date to withdraw from a course but before the tenth last teaching day of a semester or year course, a student may notify the faculty office that he or she does not intend to complete the course (by completing the Change of Curriculum Form and uploading it via Service Request on Peoplesoft). In this case the course remains on the record with a result of INC. During the last ten days of a semester or year course such notifications will no longer be accepted and a result of DPR or AB will be awarded by the department.

No withdrawal is possible after the 'cancel transcript' entry date.

2.4 Add an Individual Course

2.5 Sibling Rebate Bursary

Undergraduate Full-time Students with South African Citizenship or Permanent Residence

An undergraduate full-time student -

- who is a South African citizen or has South African permanent residence;
- who has siblings at UCT also studying towards a full-time undergraduate degree;
- whose total family income is below R750,000;
- where the student or siblings are not in receipt of financial assistance, sponsorship or the UCT Staff Tuition rate:

will on successful application to the Manager, Student Financial Aid Office, receive a bursary equivalent to 20% of their sibling's tuition fees.

This concession does not apply to the tuition fees of the first child and funding received will be limited to the costs of all courses registered for at the start of the academic year. Funding will be adjusted should a sibling cancel a course/s or receive alternate funding.

Families with more than 2 siblings in full-time undergraduate study at UCT and whose income exceeds the stated cut-off may apply for special consideration.

This funding is not automatically renewed and must be applied for every year.

Application Closing Date is 30 April in the year of study. No late applications will be considered.

2.6 Undergraduate Students Wishing to Take Additional Courses

A student -

- other than a student who is catching up on his/her studies;
- who is permitted in any given year by Senate to take one or more courses in addition to the full standard curriculum;
- on the grounds of a good academic record. Ordinarily this is taken to be students on the Dean's merit list;
- in order to enrich and enhance his/her curriculum.

may, on successful application to the Senate Committee responsible, have the course fee waived for such additional course(s)

14 ACADEMIC FEES

Where courses chosen are priced differently, the student will effectively be charged and pay for the most expensive set of courses making up a full standard curriculum.

In such cases, the price for all courses taken will be raised on the fees statement, and a credit will be given to reduce the overall cost in line with the above paragraph.

2.7 Leave of Absence

A student who is granted an academic concession for Leave of Absence will be entitled to a fee rebate depending on the date and period for which the Leave of Absence is granted. Refer Rule G.16.

These dates will be strictly adhered to. Should a student register late the same number of days will be applied to calculate the rebate. No further concessions will be granted if Leave of Absence is granted after the above deadlines.

Students are required to pay the minimum prescribed academic fees prior to graduation.

3. OTHER FEES AND LEVIES

3.1 **Sports Clubs and Societies**

Additional fees for registered students are payable in respect of the following:

Subscriptions to Clubs and Societiesvariable up to R 3 000

Membership lapses at the end of each academic year and students have to re-register each year should they wish to continue their membership. There is no refund if a student cancels his/her membership during the year.

Financial aid and some bursaries do not pay for clubs and societies; therefore, students should reconsider joining or visit Department of Student Affairs office for assistance.

3.2 Supplementary or Deferred Examinations

(Students granted permission in terms of rule G20.10 to write off-campus are liable for the cost incurred in making off-campus provision.)

3.3 Ordinary Examinations without Re-attendance at Course

Any other subject: including students writing it for purpose of entrance examinations R 600

3.4 Credit and/or Exemption

The fee for exemption from a course, and/or credit for a course completed at another university, is R100 per course or per half course with a maximum fee of R 500.

3.5 **Degree and Certificates**

Degree certificates are handed to graduates presented for their degrees at the graduation ceremony or available for collection or courier (courier fee is dependent on area) as soon as possible thereafter to graduates admitted to their degrees in absentia.

It is the student's responsibility to ensure their names are correct on record before graduation. Reprinted degree certificates for name corrections will be issued at a fee of R400.

A duplicate certificate of any UCT qualification will be issued at a fee of R 800 where satisfactory evidence of destruction or irretrievable loss of the original is submitted.

3.8 Verification of Past Training in Faculty of Health Sciences

The verification of the undergraduate training of UCT graduates is done by the Faculty Office of Health Sciences. The verification of postgraduate medical training is done by individual departments but coordinated by the Faculty Office. Foreign professional boards have different requirements for the registration of South African health sciences graduates in those countries. Verification fees at the UCT Faculty of Health Sciences depend on the complexity of the documentation to be completed, availability of information and the required form of transmission (e.g. by registered airmail or by courier, within or outside Southern Africa).

The usual period of preparing verification documentation is 6 to 8 weeks.

39 Fee for Replacement Student Identity/Access Control Card

A lost or damaged replacement Student Identity/Access Control card may be obtained on payment of a fee of R120. Payments are made at the Cashiers Office, Level 3, Kramer Law Building, Middle Campus. Students must present proof of payment together with his/her identity document when collecting the replacement card.

The loss of the card must be reported immediately to the Access Control Office in the Geological Sciences Extension Building, Room 2.01, Upper Campus.

3.10 Late Registration Fee

A fee of R2 000 will be levied on students who fail to register on the appointed day, which is reducible by the Dean on a sliding scale, for good cause shown.

3.11 Late Changes of Curriculum

A student who wishes to add a course to his/her curriculum after the Friday of the first full week after the start of the course requires a concession in terms of rule G15 of the General Rules and Policies handbook. Penalties will apply. Refer 2.4.

3.12 **Student Wellness Services**

Students who utilise the Student Wellness Service are expected to pay a nominal fee for consultations with a health practitioner (medical practitioner, psychologist, clinical nurse practitioner), medication and certain investigations. Payment options include cash or card for these services the debt incurred will be debited to the student's fee account, and like all fees owed, will be collected in line with UCT process like all fees owed. Students will not be denied health service if they are unable to pay. Students receiving Financial Aid from NSFAS are not charged for consultations with a health practitioner.

A valid student card must be produced when making use of this service

3.13 Parking Disks

Parking disks are sold to staff and students who wish to park motor vehicles (motor cars, motor cycles, motor scooters or motorised bicycles) on any of the campuses. The prices for these disks are set annually. Students are required to pay for parking disk when they are applied for, and the costs of parking disc cannot be charged to student fee accounts. Students from 2nd year are eligible for a parking disk. However, 1st year students are allowed to apply for a motorcycle disk.

3.14 Incidental Charges

Certain charges, which vary according to circumstances, and which should be paid in cash, will be debited to the students' fees accounts should they be incurred by students and not settled timeously, for example parking fines, disciplinary fines (including those imposed in Residences), library fines and the cost of replacement of library materials, damage charges raised by Residences. Note that all charges debited to student fee accounts are subject to interest on late payment.

4 INFORMATION FOR SPONSORS

The following information is supplied to help a sponsor to interpret the fee accounts sent during the year. Additionally, it is supplied to assist sponsors in their calculation of funds needed by their students for costs which do not appear on fee accounts e.g. food and lodging outside University residence, education material required and sundry expenses. Please return to the Fees Office any fee statements which are not for your account, or which have been addressed to you in error. Regular campus communications will be updated onto UCT website.

- 4 1 The balance of any scholarship or award, after settlement of fees, will be refunded to the student on receipt of your payment. Sponsors must inform UCT in writing if surplus funding is not to be paid out to a student. In most cases, students use funding from additional sources to help them meet expenses incurred in connection with their studies (for example, accommodation and subsistence, books and stationery, transport). Please therefore, ignore credits of this nature when calculating the amount due by you.
- The estimated minimum amount required for board and lodging by students not 42 accommodated in residence is R 126 690 per year or R 139 320 for Medical Students who have a longer academic year. We suggest that sponsors require from their students verifiable board and lodging expense accounts if the students reside outside official University accommodation.
- Students accommodated in a catering residence who have **not** chosen the full meal option 4.3 will require the following additional funds to cover meals taken elsewhere:

- Students accommodated in self-catering residences will require an approximate amount of 4.4 R36 000 per year (R3 600 per month) to cover the cost of meals.

Health Science Students in self-catering residences will require an approximate amount of **R43 000** per year (**R4 300** per month) to cover the cost of meals.

International students are required to pay fees in addition to their academic and residence fees. Which fees must be paid depends on the chosen programme of study, and on the student's nationality or citizenship. Unless otherwise indicated, all fees are charged in South African Rand (ZAR).

Where a student is registering for non-degree purposes, the fee is programme-specific. Students registering for non-degree purpose should refer to sections 5.1 through 5.3 below. These sections outline fee liability for the following programmes of study.

- Semester Study Abroad
- Exchange
- Occasional studies for individual course enrolment or for research

Where a student is registering for a programme of study leading to a qualification to be conferred by the University of Cape Town, that student's fee status is based on their nationality or citizenship at the point of registration. International full-degree students should refer to sections 5.4 through 5.6. These sections outline the fee liability for the following programmes of study.

- Undergraduate qualifications (Bachelors, Diploma, Higher Certificate)
- Postgraduate taught qualifications (coursework Masters (including MMed and MPhil sub-specialities), Honours, Postgraduate Diploma, Postgraduate Certificate)
- Research qualifications (Masters by dissertation only and PhD)
- Qualifications offered by the Graduate School of Business (GSB)

5.1 Semester Study Abroad (SSA) Programmes

The SSA programme is a study abroad programme for any student (regardless of nationality) taking courses for one or two semesters only towards a qualification from a university established outside of South Africa. SSA students are registered at UCT for non-degree purposes. Credits for courses in the SSA programme do not count towards a South African degree but may be transferred towards a degree in another country.

The programme charges a package fee covering course tuition fees for up to four semester courses and services covered by the International Administrative Fee. Fees will be payable in advance, prior to registration at UCT.

International Occasional Studies students who wish to enrol in one or two courses only should consult section 5.3 below. South African or SADC students who wish to enrol for Occasional Studies for non-degree purposes should apply for admission to the relevant Faculty Office.

5.2 **Exchange Programmes**

The tuition and administrative fees for international exchange students enrolling at UCT are dependent on the programme. Students are accepted into the programme in terms of a signed inter-institutional agreement which lays out the fee liability of participating students. For further details, contact the International Office by e-mailing SSA@uct.ac.za.

In certain cases, an Exchanges Levy (which covers administrative and support services broadly equivalent to the International Administrative Fee) will be applicable. Fees will be payable in advance, prior to registration at UCT.

Exchanges Levy US\$ 253

Exchange students must register as UCT students for non-degree purposes and enrol in courses. For courses taken towards a taught qualification at a non-South African university, registration is via the Semester Study Abroad programme (see section 5.1 above).

Students pursuing, at their home (non-South African) university, a postgraduate degree by research only, should enrol in the hosting faculty's International Occasional Studies research courses. Thes are differentiated by the intended period of attendance (see section 5.3.2 below). For details about applying, write to SSA@uct.ac.za

Note: Fees for students in a joint or co-badged Master's or PhD are specific to the interinstitutional agreement. Contact IAPO-finance@uct.ac.za for details.

5.3 International Occasional Students

Occasional Studies is a programme for students with an undergraduate degree, or appropriate qualifications or experience, to register at UCT for non-degree purposes (see General Rules and Policies, handbook 3, for further details). Students enrolled in courses for Occasional Studies will receive a transcript of learning (for taught courses) or attendance (for research courses).

Students must typically have completed a degree or be registered for a degree at a non-South African university to be eligible.

For details about enrolling as an international occasional student for taught courses, see 5.3.1 below.

For details about enrolling as an international occasional student to pursue research towards a research qualification elsewhere, see 5.3.2 below.

The fee status of a student registering for Occasional Studies is based on that student's citizenship at the point of registration unless that student is attending as an exchange or Semester Study Abroad student, in which case the fee outlined in sections 5.1 and 5.2 will apply.

5.3.1 Independent International Occasional Studies (taught courses)

Students are required to enrol in courses, attend classes, and write exams. A South African matriculation exemption is required for acceptance into this programme at undergraduate level.

International SADC students registering for international occasional studies pay tuition fees for individual courses and a SADC Administrative Fee.

International non-SADC Occasional Studies students pay:

International Occasional Studies students taking three or more courses within a single year of registration will be charged the Semester Study Abroad package tuition fee (see section 5.1 above).

Fees will be payable in advance, prior to registration at UCT.

Students participating in a semester study abroad or exchange programme should refer to section 5.1 and 5.2 of this handbook.

5.3.2 Independent International Occasional Studies (research courses)

Visiting international students who are not taking UCT taught courses but who wish to pursue research towards studies at their own university by using UCT's libraries and other facilities, must first make contact with a UCT department to ensure they will be welcome, and obtain an assurance that there are necessary resources (with mutual understanding of expectations) to accommodate them in the host department. Thereafter, online application should be made for admission as a postgraduate Occasional Studies student. (For details about applying, write to ssa@uct.ac.za.)

An international occasional research student does not attend lectures, work at UCT, or write examinations, but may participate in research seminars and activities. International occasional students who hope to have research supervision must make arrangements with the host department noting that access to a co-supervisor is subject to availability.

International occasional students pursuing research register as a student for non-degree purpose at UCT, enrol in a research course, and receive a transcript of attendance.

Research students enrolling for non-degree purposes under the terms of an interinstitutional exchange agreement should refer to section 5.2 above.

5.4 International Students who intend to study for a full UCT qualification

Where a student is registering for a programme of study leading to a qualification to be conferred by the University of Cape Town, that student's fee status is determined by their nationality or acquired citizenship at the point of registration. Students should apply for

admission to UCT and registration for a UCT qualification using the passport issued by the country of their nationality or citizenship.

International students must pay the minimum initial academic and residence fees prior to registration or by Friday 07 February 2025 whichever date is the earlier (see 1.1.1 of this handbook). Accounts are sent out by the Fees Office, except for GSB programmes (covered under section 5.5 of this handbook) which are billed by the Graduate School of Business.

There are three categories of international student, each with associated fees:

- SADC students are citizens of countries in the Southern African Development Community;
- International students from African countries outside of the SADC 2. region:
- 3. International students from countries outside of Africa.

All international students must pay the academic fee for the courses in which they enrol plus the International or SADC Administrative Fee. The International/ SADC Administrative Fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.

Students who are designated as special status by the South African Department of Home Affairs (such as official refugees, asylum seekers and diplomatic representatives) and international UCT staff and their dependents are subject to different fee arrangements outlined in the relevant section below.

SADC students

The Southern African Development Community (SADC) member countries are: Angola, Botswana, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Eswatini, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Seychelles, South Africa, United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

For the purposes of academic and residence fees, citizens of SADC countries registering for a UCT qualification are treated the same as South African citizens and permanent residents. They must pay (i) tuition fees for each course in which they enrol, (ii) a SADC Administrative Fee, and (iii) any applicable residence fees.

Non-SADC international students

Non-SADC international students registering for a UCT qualification are required to pay an additional international or out-of-state levy. They must pay (i) tuition fees for each course in which they enrol, (ii) an International Term Fee, (iii) an International Administrative Fee, and (iv) any applicable residence fees.

Non-SADC international students studying for Postgraduate Diplomas, Honours or Coursework Master's Degrees are advised to check section 5.6 for information regarding Scholarships available to them.

Students designated as special status by the South African Department of Home Affairs

For the purposes of academic and residence fees, official refugees, asylum seekers and diplomatic representatives registering for a UCT qualification are treated the same as South African citizens and permanent residents. To qualify in this category, students must have documentation as follows:

- Refugees: a refugee ID book (also known as a Refugee Identity Document) issued by the South African Department of Home Affairs.
- Asylum seekers: a permit issued by the South African Department of Home Affairs.

Official refugees and documented asylum seekers must pay (i) the academic fees for each course in which they enrol and (ii) any applicable residence fees.

Accredited diplomatic representatives of a foreign government in South Africa (or their dependents) are treated the same as South African citizens or permanent residents. They must pay (i) tuition fees for each course in which they enrol, (ii) a SADC Administrative Fee, and (iii) any applicable residence fees.

International UCT staff (and their dependents)

International UCT staff members (or their dependents) who qualify for the HR staff tuition concession must pay (i) the academic fees for each course in which they enrol and (ii) any applicable residence fees.

Changes to citizenship and confirmation of fee status

Where an international student acquires alternative citizenship, that student may apply to the International Office to have the nationality or citizenship in their student record amended. This may affect the student's fee status.

Applications to amend a student's citizenship or residency status must be made in writing to the International Office. On presentation of a certified copy of the original documented proof of alternate citizenship, the International Office will evaluate the student's eligibility for a change in fee status.

Where an application for a change in citizenship and fee status is received by 31 July, the amendment will apply to the current year of registration. Such a student may be eligible for a partial or full refund of the International Term Fee.

Where an application for a change in citizenship and fee status is received after 31 July, adjustments to the fee will be applied for registration in the following academic year.

The International/ SADC Administrative Fee is non-refundable in all circumstances. Students whose citizenship or fee status changes after registration are not eligible for a refund of the International/ SADC Administrative Fee.

When applying for an amendment to the citizenship record, students should submit the following documentation:

- Where a student has acquired South African citizenship: A certified copy of the South African bar-coded identity book or smart ID card
- Where a student has acquired South African permanent residence: A certified copy of the permanent residence permit as issued by the South African Department of Home Affairs.
- Where a student is recognized by the South African Department of Home Affairs as an asylum seeker or refugee: A certified copy of the Asylum Seeker permit or Refugee Identity Document as issued by the South African Department of Home Affairs.
- Where a student has acquired citizenship of a country other than that with which they registered at UCT: A certified copy of the relevant passport.

Note that in all circumstances, visa regulations will continue to apply.

5.4.1 Course Fees

The University of Cape Town operates on a course-based fee structure. Students will be charged for all academic courses in which they enrol.

The fee for each academic course can be found in section 12 of this handbook.

The typical course fees you can expect to pay per qualification or programme of study and by year of study, can be found in section 11 of this handbook.

5.4.2 International/SADC Administrative Fee

All international full-degree students are required to pay the non-refundable International Administrative Fee covering costs related to immigration/visa clearance, registration and orientation of international students. The fee is applicable for each year of registration and must be paid prior to registration.

International Administrative Fee ZAR 5 300

All international SADC students are required to pay the non-refundable SADC Administrative Fee covering costs related to immigration/visa clearance, registration and orientation of international students. The fee is applicable for each year of registration and must be paid prior to registration.

SADC Administrative Fee ZAR 5 300

Students registering for the first time in the second semester of a single academic year (running from January to December annually) will be charged the full International/SADC Administrative Fee.

5.4.3 International Term Fee

International non-SADC students registering for coursework qualifications will be charged an International Term Fee, each year of registration. This fee is divided into two categories: one for non-SADC African students and another for students from outside Africa (the rest of the world).

Students registering for the first time in the 2nd semester need to pay only 50% of the standard International Term Fee. Additionally, students who submit their thesis / dissertation or complete their degree programme by the official deadline in the first semester will receive a 50% rebate on their International Term Fee, which is processed after submission only. Published deadlines for registration and/or cancellation apply. See section 5.8.3 for details.

5.4.4 Terms of Payment for Academic Fees

All required fee payments should be made prior to registration or by 07 February 2025 whichever date is earlier.

Students registering for a research qualification with no fixed start date (e.g. Master's by research or PhD) must settle their fees in full prior to registration. Students registering for the first time at the start of the second semester of an academic year must settle their fees in full prior to registration.

All other students can make payment of academic fees in two tranches. Payments made after the dates shown below will be subject to a late payment surcharge of 5% of the unpaid amount due.

The terms of payment for students in UCT residences can be found at sections 5.7 and 13.1 of this handbook. The minimum first residence payment is required prior to registration.

International payments should be made using Flywire, which is UCT's online payment portal. Visit https://uct.ac.za/international/student-support/fees for more details about paying via Flywire.

Alternatively, students may pay via electronic transfer. To avoid delays for registration, allow at least 14 working days for electronic payments to appear in the UCT bank account.

Cheques issued by banks outside South Africa are not accepted.

5.5 Qualifications Offered by the Graduate School of **Business**

Note that all Citizens or Permanent Residents from African countries qualify for local South African fees for GSB qualifications.

An acceptance fee of ZAR 25,000 is payable on acceptance of study offer and is applicable to all GSB students applying for Masters level programmes. Postgraduate Diploma level students must pay an acceptance fee of ZAR 15,000. This is credited against the fees due upon registration.

Withdrawal of Acceptance

All requests for cancellation shall be in writing and addressed to GSB Admissions.

Subject to section 17(2) of the Consumer Protection Act, a cancellation fee is payable as follows:

- (a) 20% of the amount will be forfeited if notice of cancellation is received six weeks or more prior to the start of the programme orientation and
- (b) the entire amount is forfeited if the notice of cancellation is received less than six weeks prior to the start of the programme orientation.

In cases where programmes are offered over 2 years, the fees for 2025 (i.e. for the

second year of enrolment) will be adjusted to make provision for annual fee increases.

5.6 International and refugee scholarships

A limited number of scholarships are available annually to international and refugee students for postgraduate study in any discipline at UCT. As there is only one call for applications each year, it is important that the application procedure is strictly followed. These scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis and preference is given to candidates registered for higher degrees.

All UCT international and refugee students' scholarships are supplementary as a contribution towards Cost of Attendance. Students who apply must have the means to fund their studies.

Values.

Honours - R25 000

Master's - R30 000

Doctoral - R35 000

The scholarships are renewable for the duration of the programme of study, if satisfactory progress is maintained, e.g., once for master's (2nd year only) level and 2 for doctoral (2nd and 3rd year only) level. Students who are eligible for renewals of awards, will be automatically renewed on condition of satisfactory progress.

Applicants must apply for full-time admission through the UCT admissions office or the faculty office. Late applications are not accepted.

5.7 Residence Fees

The first payment as stated in section 13.1 is required prior to registration for all international students and non-South African students who do not have permanent residence. This is in addition to the international fees outlined in section 5.4.

Residence fees for SADC and non-South African students

All students who receive a housing offer for UCT residence must pay the first payment by 07 February 2025. In the case of residence offers made after this date, the first payment is due immediately and must be made prior to signing into residence, i.e. R41 500 in the case of catering accommodation and R27 500 for self-catering. The balance of all residence fees is due by 31 July 2025.

Note: There is only limited accommodation available for international students in residences, consequently most international students share rented accommodation in the vicinity of the University. (Further information can be obtained from Off-Campus Student Accommodation Services or write to iapo-housing@uct.ac.za)

The residence fee for 1st Tier residences excludes the winter vacation between the first and second semesters but includes the short vacations in the first and second semesters. For 2nd and 3rd Tier residences, the fee is inclusive of the winter vacation between the first and second semester. The opening date for new students is Saturday, 01 February 2025. The same withdrawal rules apply to international students leaving residences as for local students (refer to 13.2).

5.8 International Fees Cancellation Policy

5.8.1 Semester/Study Abroad Programme

A USD 100 administration fee will be applied to all cancellations received after a *student indicates* acceptance but prior to arrival.

A USD 253 administration fee will be applied to all cancellations received after a student arrives but before registration.

A 50% fee rebate of the Semester Study Abroad package tuition fee will be applied to cancellations or withdrawals by 21 February 2025 for Semester 1 intakes and 01 August 2025 for Semester 2 intakes. There will be no fee rebate for any cancellation or withdrawal thereafter.

Notice of intention to withdraw must be made in writing to the International Office on or before the deadline. No reduction will be granted if the notice of intention to withdraw is received after the deadline. Write to: SSA@uct.ac.za

5.8.2 International Occasional Students

For international occasional studies students enrolled in taught courses, a 50% fee rebate of the course fee will be applied to withdrawal from a semester course by 21 February 2025 for Semester 1 intakes and 01 August 2025 for Semester 2 intakes. There will be no fee rebate for any cancellation or withdrawal thereafter.

Notice of intention to withdraw must be made in writing to the International Office on or before the deadline. No reduction will be granted if the notice of intention to withdraw is received after the deadline.

There will be no rebate for withdrawal from a summer term or winter term course.

For international occasional studies students enrolled in research courses, the fee reduction is based on the date of withdrawal from the course. International occasional studies for research students who decide to leave early may apply to their host department for a pro-rated refund of fees.

5.8.3 Full Degree Students (GSB students refer to section 2.2.1)

The policy and associated rebates for withdrawal of registration or cancellation of a course can be found at sections 2.2 and 2.3 respectively of this handbook. Students or their parents or guardians must give notice to discontinue studies in writing by completing the Cancellation of Registration Form and submitting this to their Faculty Office in person or by registered mail.

A reduction on the International Term Fee will be considered if registration is cancelled before:

(a) the beginning of the first quarter, 21 February 2025................. 100% adjustment before 01 August 2025 50% adjustment

Students registering for the first time in the second semester who cancel/withdraw before:

(b) the beginning of the third quarter, 01 August 2025 100% adjustment after 01 August 2025......No adjustment

No reduction of the International Term Fee will be granted if registration is cancelled after the 01 August 2025.

Note: The International/SADC Administrative Fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.

Any outstanding fees are due immediately upon cancellation of studies. For fee rebates for dropping or changing course enrolments, refer to section 2.3.

6. VISITING INTERNATIONAL AFFILIATES

Individuals who wish to pursue research by using UCT's libraries and other facilities, must first make contact with a UCT department to ensure they will be welcome and obtain an assurance that there are necessary resources (and with mutual understanding of expectations) to accommodate them in the host department. Thereafter application should be made through the International Office. If accepted, international affiliates are given third party access to UCT's facilities. International affiliates are not registered as students and do not enrol in courses, receive supervision, receive official transcripts of attendance for use towards qualifications taken elsewhere or have access to any services offered to registered students.

International affiliate fees are levied for periods of attendance (or part thereof) as outlined below. Fees are payable in advance and prior to arrival at UCT. The fees for visiting international affiliates are dependent upon the length of their stay at the University of Cape Town and are as follows.

2 months or less	USD	442
2 months to 4 months	USD	782
4 months to 6 months	USD 1	151
6 months to 12 months	USD 1	533

Fees will be payable in advance, prior to registration at UCT.

International Affiliate Fees Cancellation Policy

When affiliates withdraw from individual courses, any fee reduction is dependent on the date of withdrawal. International Affiliates who decide to leave early may apply to their host department for a pro-rata refund of fees.

7. STUDENTS REGISTERING FOR RESEARCH MASTER'S OR PHD

Students registering for the first time for a research Master's or Doctoral thesis in the second semester (from 1 July) will be granted a 50% rebate on the annual academic fee. This rebate also applies to students registering for the MMed.

8 SUBMISSION OF DOCTORAL THESES AND MASTER'S DISSERTATIONS

A rebate on the annual academic fee for a doctoral thesis or master's dissertation is granted according to the following schedule:

- In the case of a master's dissertation, this applies in the second or subsequent year in which 8.1 the dissertation is being completed;
- In the case of a doctoral thesis, this applies in the third or subsequent year in which the 8.2 thesis is being completed;
 - submission before 12 noon on Monday, 07 April 2025, the beginning (a)
 - submission before 12 noon on Monday, 28 July 2025, the beginning (b)
 - submission by 12 noon on Monday, 15 September 2025, the (c) beginning of the fourth quarter; 25% adjustment
 - submission after 12 noon on Monday, 15 September 2025nil (d)

Students who intend submitting by 12 noon on Monday 17 February 2025, the start of the 2025 academic year, do not need to reregister.

8.3 Revise and Resubmit

Where a student is required to revise and resubmit a thesis or dissertation the academic fee will be charged per quarter (i.e. if the candidate must work for up to one quarter, he/she will pay 25% of the full fee; for up to two quarters, he/she will pay 50% of the full fee and so on).

Note 1: Full annual fees will be billed from the date on which the student is notified to revise and resubmit, and any fee rebate will be processed on resubmission.

Note 2: International students who are required to revise and resubmit a dissertation or thesis and who need to re-register at the start of a new academic year, may have their international term fee pro-rated up-front where there is a clear indication from the supervisor that the student is expected to submit in a period shorter than a year.

10.8 Withdrawal of Acceptance

All requests for cancellation shall be in writing and addressed to GSB Admissions.

Subject to section 17(2) of the Consumer Protection Act, a cancellation fee is payable as follows:

- (a) 20% of the amount will be forfeited if notice of cancellation is received six weeks or more prior to the start of the programme orientation; and
- (b) the entire amount is forfeited if the notice of cancellation is received less than six weeks prior to the start of the programme orientation.

11. UCT ACADEMIC FEES

All students from outside South Africa, including students from SADC countries, should also refer to fees for international students in Section 5 of this handbook.

The University of Cape Town operates on a course-based fee structure inclusive of all "add-ons". Thus, the dictum that 'the price you see is the price you pay' applies to all academic offerings across the University.

The University's course-based fee structures, together with the relevant Faculty handbook, will enable students to accurately calculate the cost of their academic studies at UCT in 2025.

Since a student's fees account is based on his/her academic record, it is the student's responsibility to verify the correctness of his/her academic record.

To assist students and fee payers' budget for their academic studies at UCT for 2025 we have set-out below the cost of fees for a typical qualification by faculty and year of study.

Note: The following typical fees for South African students are only guidelines and will vary with the students' actual choice of courses.

12. **UCT ACADEMIC COURSES**

All students from outside South Africa, including students from SADC countries, should also refer to fees for international students in Section 5 of this handbook.

The University of Cape Town operates on a course-based fee structure inclusive of all "add-ons". Thus, the dictum that 'the price you see is the price you pay' applies to all academic offerings across the University.

Please note that residence, catering and miscellaneous fees such as subscriptions to clubs and societies are itemised and charged separately on the student fee account.

The University's course-based fee structures, together with the relevant Faculty handbook, will enable students to calculate the cost of their academic studies at UCT in 2025 accurately.

The Faculty handbook will indicate the courses that can be taken in pursuing a qualification and the relevant course code. Use this code to look up the all inclusive cost of the course in this booklet. The sum of these costs will give you the total cost for the set of chosen courses. There are no levies.

Since a student's fees account is based on his/her academic load, it is the student's responsibility to verify the correctness of his/her enrolment for courses in the current year.

## 13. RESIDENCES

#### 13.1 Terms of Payment

First payment of Residence Fees is as follows:	
i) Catering Residence (First and Second Tier)	R41 500
ii) Self Catering Residences (Second and Third Tier)	R27 500

This first payment must be made by 07 February 2025 in the case of both new and readmission students, subject to a late payment surcharge of 5%.

Students from SADC countries and non-South African students who do not have permanent residence but pay local fees, must pay the minimum first payment for academic and residence fees PLUS the SADC Administrative fee of R4,700 prior to registration or by 07 February 2025, whichever date occurs first. Please allow at least 14 working days for payment to reflect in UCT bank account to avoid delays in registration clearance being

In the case of residence offers made after 07 February 2025, the first payment is due immediately and must be made prior to signing into residence.

A student moving into university residence after registration is also required to pay the first payment as stated above.

Balance of all residence fees is due by 31 July 2025.

Students who have not been living in student housing for the first semester and who are accepted into residence for the second semester will be required to pay one half of the annual residence fee on registration or prior to registration for international students including those from SADC countries

Interest will be charged on a monthly basis at 1% on all outstanding fees.

#### 13.2 Withdrawal from Student Accommodation after the start of the Academic Year

#### 13.2.1 Fee rebate for students who withdraw after the start of the academic year

- (a) A student who enters residence and withdraws during the first semester and before the commencement of the second semester, shall be liable for a pro-rata charge plus a cancellation fee of R500.
- (b) A student completing his/her studies at the end of the first semester shall be eligible for a rebate equivalent to 50% of the annual fee (excluding levies).
- (c) A postgraduate student who is required for the purposes of his/her research to move out of Cape Town shall be eligible for a rebate on a pro-rata basis (excluding levies).
- (d) A student who withdraws during the second semester shall be liable for the full annual residence fee.

The Director of Student Housing may, however, exercise his/her discretion in

approving a rebate under special conditions pertaining to the reason for withdrawal.

(e) A student who enters residence for the first time during the second semester and who withdraws from residence shall be liable for the full fee for that semester. The Director of Student Housing may, however, exercise his/her discretion in approving a rebate under special conditions pertaining to the reason for withdrawal.

#### 13.2.2 Annual Residence fee

For the purposes of determining the penalties and refunds referred to in the rules above, the annual residence fee shall be deemed to be the sum of the room and catering overhead charges and meal option charges. The annual residence fee for these purposes <u>does not</u> include amenities, damage or laundry levies.

# 13.2.3 Student vacation accommodation for academic reasons during December, January, early February and the mid-year vacation.

A student who for academic purposes or for other purposes deemed to be acceptable by the Director of Student Housing has to be in Cape Town before residence opens or after closing may be accommodated in a residence which has been opened for the purpose, provided that has complied with the application procedures laid down by the Residences Committee. A Student will pay for this accommodation at a daily rate to be determined from time to time by the Residences Committee.

## 13.3 Residence Fees and Occupancy

All students from outside South Africa and the other SADC countries should refer to (5.8) for additional information.

Returning students who have been offered a place in residence will have their place cancelled if fees are not settled by end November 2024.

The fees shown below are inclusive of all compulsory levies and other compulsory charges. Any charges incurred by students for damage to, or loss of, University property, will be charged directly to the students' fees accounts, if this charge is not paid in cash to the Residence concerned.

The fee for the 1st tier accommodation excludes the winter vacation between the first and second semesters but includes the short vacation in the first semester and that in the second semester. The fee for 2nd tier and 3rd tier includes these vacations. For the purposes of a student housing place the academic year shall be deemed to end 72 hours after the student's last scheduled examination or in the case of a graduand, on the official closing date of the residence each semester.

The opening date for all residence students is Saturday, 01 February 2025, except for Health Science designated residences which open on Friday, 10 January 2025. The closing date for 1st and 2nd tier non-health science residences is 12h00 on Saturday 22 November 2025, Health Science designated residences will close on Monday 01 December 2025. 3rd Tier residences will close on Friday, 12 December 2025. Offers of accommodation to students, who have not signed into residence by 18h00 on Tuesday 04 February 2025 will be cancelled. Students who are required to attend the University prior to the official opening dates or are required to attend the University after the official closing date, will need to book with the vacation accommodation and will be charged accordingly.

#### A. FIRST TIER (CATERING) ACCOMMODATION

Students have a choice of 4 meal options. The cost of the meal option is not included in the residence fee. The chosen meal option must be added to the residence fee.
